## About BCAMP

The ASEAN region occupies just over 3 per cent of the world's total land area, but is home to nearly 26 per cent of all described species. The region has three of the 17 known mega-diverse countries (Indonesia, Malaysia, and the Philippines), but it has four of the world's 36 biodiversity hotspots (Indo-Burma, the Philippines, Sundaland, and Wallacea). Biodiversity conservation in the ASEAN region contributes significantly to regional and global environmental sustainability and maintains ecosystem services which are vital to the well-being of human societies.

Starting in 2017, the European Union has funded the *Biodiversity Conservation and Management of Protected Areas in ASEAN* (BCAMP) Project. BCAMP aims to enhance environmental, social and economic well-being by reducing biodiversity loss in ASEAN through biodiversity conservation and effective management of protected areas.

The five-year project is implemented by the ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity (ACB) with technical assistance provided by NIRAS International Consulting. BCAMP has activities at three levels:

1. Site Level
2. National Level
3. Regional Level

## Target Outcomes

- Management in 10 ASEAN Heritage Parks (AHPs) or other protected areas improved
- Protection systems in 10 AHPs/protected areas improved
- Transboundary collaboration on Protected Areas Management achieved in two sites
- Number of declared AHPs increased
- Biodiversity conservation integrated in national education curricula, as well as national and sub-national development plans
- Youth involvement in conservation initiatives in the region increased
- Regulations for Protected Areas updated and revised
- New conservation funding mechanisms are identified and designed
- The role and capacity of the ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity is strengthened
